



Since our humble beginnings in 2006, Literacy Now has grown from one school with 91 students to serving more than 1,300 students and parents on 14 HISD and one Aldine ISD Title I campuses and in low-income community sites during the 2021-2022 school year. Yet, our work is far from complete. Literacy Now is currently in the middle of an aggressive strategic expansion campaign to serve more children and while we have made great strides, we are reaching less than 23% of the HISD and Aldine ISD students who urgently need the programming we provide.



While our numbers and impact may be large, we always focus on that one child that is too embarrassed to read in front of her friends or that one parent that just needs to know that they are more than able to help their child learn. Literacy Now is about relationships and we are mission driven to help those we serve become the best versions of themselves.

"I have gotten better at reading because I practice all the time. I used to not like to read, but now I love it!" Lauren was a 1st grader who could barely read a kindergarten level book at the beginning of our Reading Intervention program. After 11 weeks of individualized instruction from our highly qualified interventionists, Lauren was reading books on a 1st grade level. With her newfound reading skills we have no doubt that Lauren will succeed!

Krystal and her family live at New Hope Housing, a wonderful place that provides provides transitional housing for those that have experienced

homelessness. Through a partnership with New Hope Housing, Literacy

Now's mobile classroom, The Reading Express, provides weekly sessions for children 2 months to 4 years of age and their caregivers. After all, a person is a person, no matter how small. Krystal and her three month old daughter were one of the original participants at New Hope. Fast forward three years later, both Krystal and her daughter just completed another year of this critical early reading intervention program. Krystal stated that "Now she is three years old and ready for school. The lessons, repetition, and socialization, it all helped get her ready."



HOUSTON READS DAY


March 2, 2023
