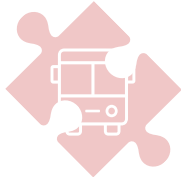

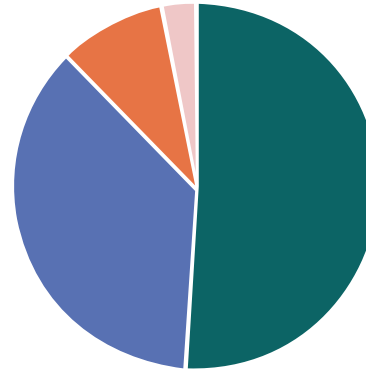

ONE CHILD. ONE STORY. ENDLESS POSSIBILITIES.

When Sebastian, a kindergartener at Kujawa EC/PreK/K in Aldine ISD, joined Literacy Now's Reading Intervention program, he struggled to recognize sight words and was reading below grade level. Like many young learners, he often felt discouraged and lacked confidence in his abilities.

With personalized instruction, consistent encouragement, and his own determination, Sebastian's story began to change.



By the end of the program, he wasn't just reading with confidence – he was thriving. Every new word that he mastered strengthened not only his literacy skills but also his belief in himself.

His biggest cheerleader has been his mom, Janett, a single mother of four, who has supported him every step of his reading journey. Reflecting on his progress, she shared:



"The Reading Intervention program has given him the push he needed to succeed, and now he is the self-proclaimed 'best reader' in his class."

Sebastian's journey is a powerful reminder that when children receive the right support at the right time, they gain far more than reading skills. They discover confidence, unlock new opportunities, and begin to see themselves as capable learners with limitless potential.



GROWING READERS, BUILDING CONFIDENCE

Every success story begins with one child – and a community that believes in them.

This year, Reading Intervention students achieved more than reading gains. They built confidence, participated more actively in

the classroom, earned recognition for their hard work, and discovered a genuine love of reading that extended beyond the school day. Teachers celebrated their growth, parents watched their confidence soar, and students began to see themselves as capable, successful readers.

When we come together as ONE, we do more than teach children to read – we empower them with skills, confidence, and belief in themselves, empowering them to succeed in school, at home, and throughout their lives.

PUTTING YOUNG READERS ON THE RIGHT TRACK

This year, our Reading Express mobile classroom reached a record number of children and families, expanding access to early literacy experiences through the generous support of donors and our seven community site partners.

Designed for children ages 2 months to 4 years old, this “school on wheels” delivers weekly, one-hour interactive literacy experiences directly to neighborhoods across Harris County. Through books, songs, play, and caregiver engagement, the Reading Express helps build the language, vocabulary, and early literacy foundations that prepare



young children for kindergarten and future academic success.

Throughout the year, families also enjoyed special visits from guest readers, including Harris County Precinct 3 Commissioner Tom Ramsey and Harris County Precinct 4 Commissioner Leslie Briones,

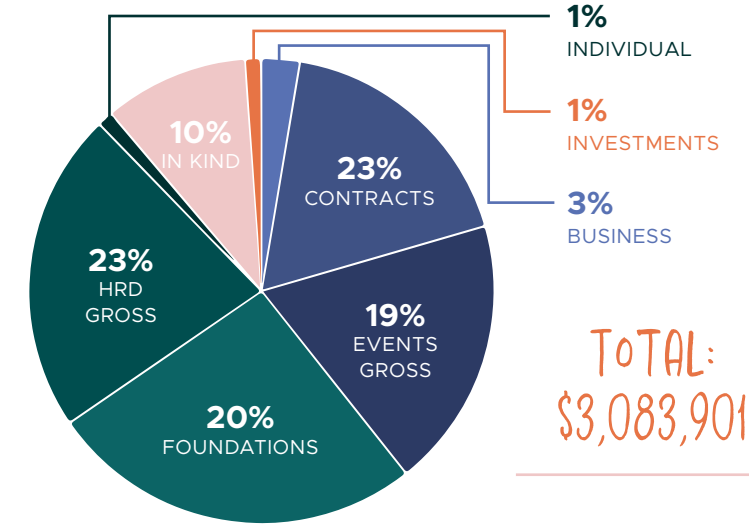
who shared the joy of reading with our youngest learners and reinforced the importance of making books and storytelling part of everyday family life.

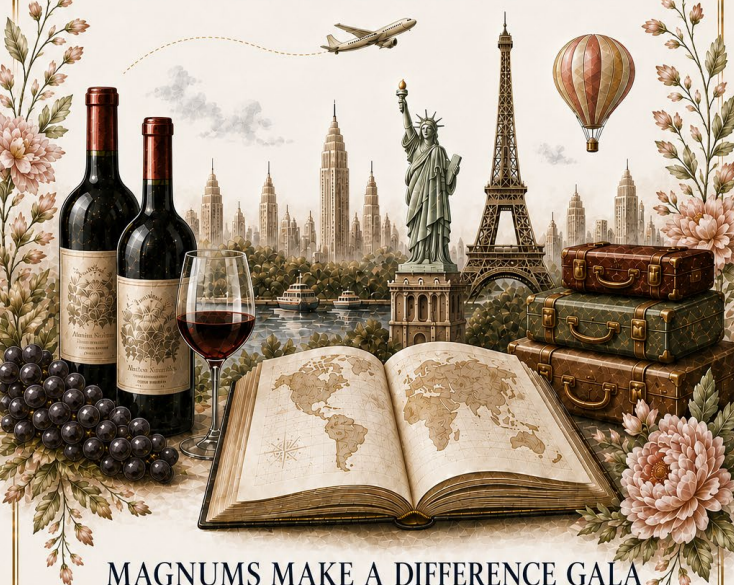

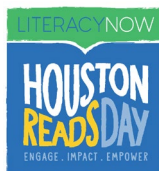
